MENTORING FOR SCHOOL SUCCESS

Joseph Rodriguez is a 9 year old Paonia child who shows great promise. His mother, Anna Rodriguez, is being assisted in raising him by Dave and Jill Knutson who live nearby. Dave and Jill came into Families Plus in 2011 already seasoned in mentoring children. They had previously invested in a child from 1982-1990 with whom they still communicate.



Knutson's and Joseph spend regular time together doing outdoor activities, hanging out in the Knutson home, and doing homework. Jill is a certified teacher and Dave is a natural teacher. They are so committed to Joseph's education that they have agreed this winter and spring to have Joseph in their home during the school week so he can continue this education at Paonia Elementary school where he is making strong academic progress, while his mother needs to be in the Montrose area.

Anna, Joseph's mother reports that "she is developing an extraordinary job opportunity. Anna has been working with Edith Johnston with the DVR for some time. This job opportunity is Anna's first attempt to honor her unique attributes while developing an adequate income."

Although this amount of time with a mentored child is unusual in the Families Plus program, occasionally situations lend themselves to a special arrangement. The Knutson's are entirely invested in making sure that Joseph has a strong education to carry him forward, as is his mother.

Joseph likes to snowshoe, play video games, and feed biscuits to the family dog, Peaches. Although comfortable in the Knutson home, he is always happy to see his mom. Joseph is doing very well in school; he is on the Honor Roll.

VENUS STRATTON MEMORIAL

Many children have already found and loved a new piece of playground equipment next to the Lions Pavilion at Confluence Park in Delta. It was installed in August by the City of Delta Parks and Recreation Department. The Spin-Around toy allows a child to whirl around as fast as their arms can pump while firmly anchored to the sturdy equipment.



On Tuesday, October 23, a small group of friends and family of Venus Stratton gathered to formally dedicate this toy that was purchased in honor of Venus. Venus died during the summer of 2010 in a bicycle accident at the age of 12. Venus was known for her creative, joyful, and generous spirit. The toy exemplifies her zest for life and for fun. The toy was purchased by the Families Plus memorial fund set up for Venus and with a donation by the Delta Lions Club under the leadership of Sheri Serve. On hand for the dedication were Venus’ grandfather, Garris Flebbe, who took a spin on the toy for Venus, Venus’ Families Plus mentors, Ed and Cheryl Oeltjenbruns, and Venus’ best friend of many years, Anna Fuller. The Families Plus organization continues to support and encourage Venus’ grandparents, Kristi Hayward-Lake and Garris Flebbe, as it is the organization’s tradition to stay with families despite what may come.

KIDS PASTA PROJECT

BOARD OF DIRECTORS EXPANDS

The Board of Directors elected two new members to the Board at their regular bimonthly meeting on January 15, 2013 – **Dave Armlovich and Al Hale**. **Dave Armlovich** already has six years of volunteering for Families Plus to his credit. He manages the Web Site, <http://www.familiesplus.net>, and lends his technical expertise to computer challenges in the office. Dave is a GIS expert at the U.S. Forest Service, an avid outdoorsman, and frequent volunteer in the community. He recently returned from two weeks of hiking up to 18,500 feet in the Himalaya Mountains.

Al Hale was also elected to membership. He is trained as a mechanical engineer and settled into western Colorado for business management positions. He is currently semi-retired in the Delta area. He brings to the Board of Director previous experience in working toward organizational excellence on the Board of Directors of Arrowhead (Cimarron). His business management skills and attention to detail will be in valuable in advancing toward the Board goal of achieving nonprofit excellence.



RESTRUCTURING COMPLETE

Families Plus started out their new fiscal year on October 1 with a new organizational structure in place. Dr. Holland has shifted out of clinical services and into a program management and development role. She will be developing a treatment manual, integrating Families Plus services with other children's services locally and statewide, raising operating funds, working with the Board of Directors on their increasingly important role, and managing publicity and volunteer recruitment.

She has been replaced in clinical leadership by Mariah Emond, M.A., LPC, CAC II. Emond has been a leader in the mental health care community of western slope Colorado since 2005. She was awarded her Master's Degree in the Science of Counseling at Alaska Pacific University in 2005. She had previously earned a Bachelors of Science in Occupational Therapy by Colorado State University in 2002. She has a prominent treatment role with Drug Free Delta County and provides occupational therapy to students of Delta County Public schools. Currently, she is progressing in doctoral Health Administration program with the University of Phoenix. Mariah oversees the clinical services of Families Plus and also works with a few of the participating families. Three other licensed mental health care providers also work with the children and their families – Tom Friel LPC, Karen Wolfram LPC, and Suzanne Horning-Rieder LPC.

Dawn Reeder, the current president of the Board of Directors has accepted temporary responsibilities as the acting Executive Officer of the organization while funding is secured to fill this position.

FUNDING CORNER

Colorado Health Foundation

Families Plus has just entered the third year of a large grant from the Colorado Health Foundation designed to increase the number of under-served Coloradans who regularly receive primary, mental or oral health care. Since November 2011, Families Plus has added 14 children to receive long term services with the program. Local pediatrician, Janet Moore, MD, a partner in this grant, provides weekly free clinics at the old Delta Middle School for uninsured and underinsured children. With an appointment, parents can get a free health screening and needed immunizations by calling 970 874 9715. Families Plus along with Dr. Moore are working to make health care accessible to all children in Delta, County.

The vision of the Colorado Health Foundation is to make Colorado the healthiest state in the nation. To achieve this vision, the Colorado Health Foundation invests in grants and initiatives to health-related nonprofits that encourage healthy living and increase the number of Coloradans with health insurance. The organization also works to ensure that Coloradans have access to quality, coordinated care as well as operating medical education programs to increase the health care workforce.

Wolcott Family Foundation Supports Local Children

The Wolcott Family Foundation granted \$5,000 to Families Plus during their annual meeting in November. This foundation is a three generation, family-run organization, convinced of the power of small groups to make a significant difference in helping people change their world. A guiding principal of this organization is the parable of the fish: "If you give a person a fish, you feed them for a day. If you teach them how to fish, you feed them for a lifetime." The Wolcott Family Foundation has chosen to support the Families Plus program that invests in many local children by organizing small groups of supporters to invest in each child. Families Plus is a homegrown mentoring program designed to help parents raise strong and healthy children when their circumstances are challenging. Families Plus wraps volunteers and needed supplies around these families and children, always aiming toward healthy development. Through this program, deserving children in Delta County enjoy the benefits of mentoring families, tutors, fees for sports and activities, summer camps, and the watchful eye of a mental health care professional to guide healthy development and steer around problems.

The Wolcott Family Foundation promotes social change and environmental stewardship. While based in Denver, many family members active in the foundation live in the Delta County area.


